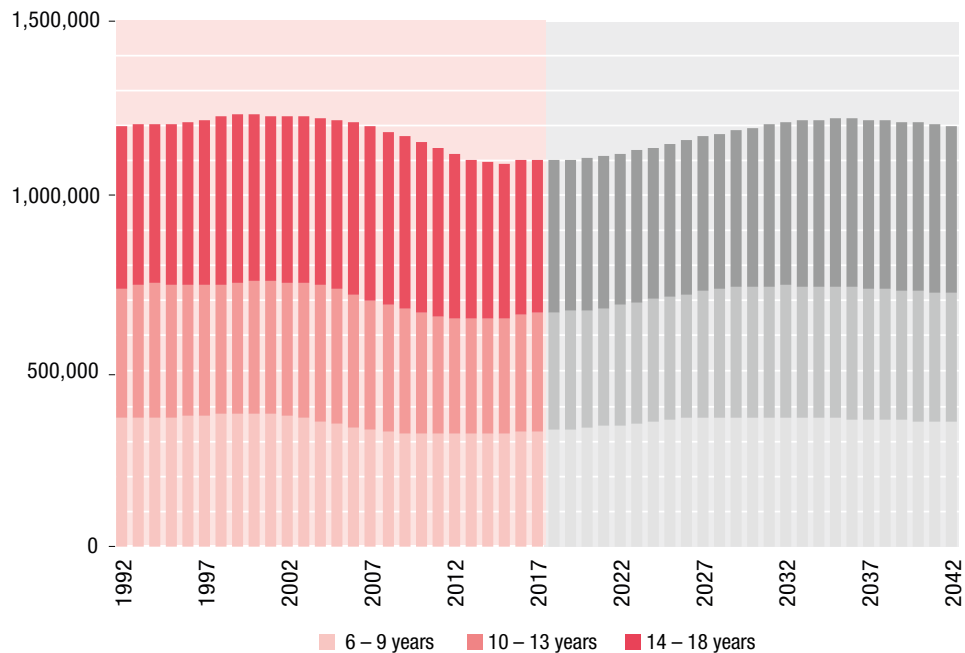

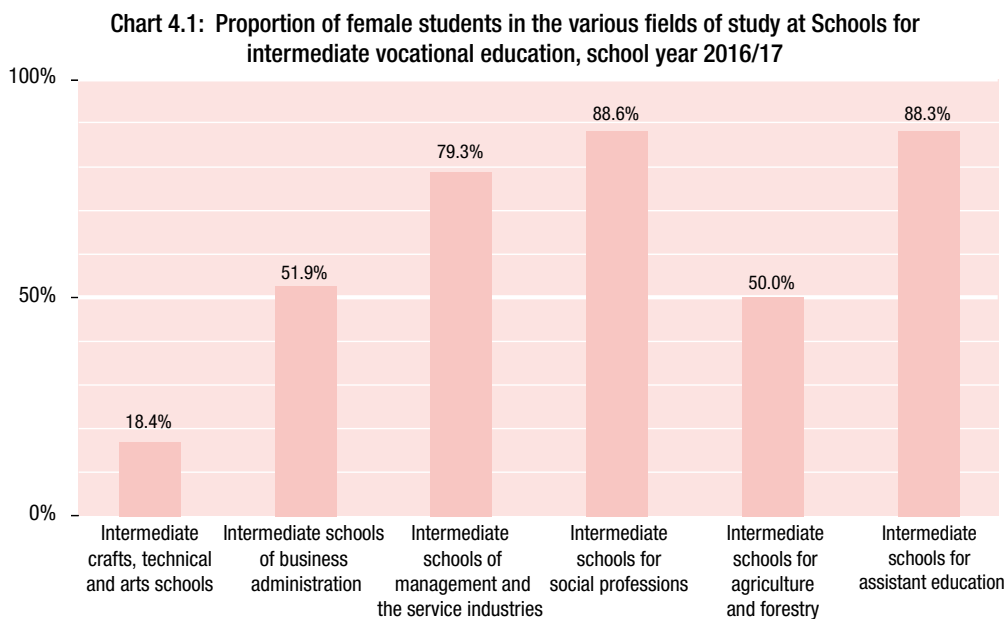
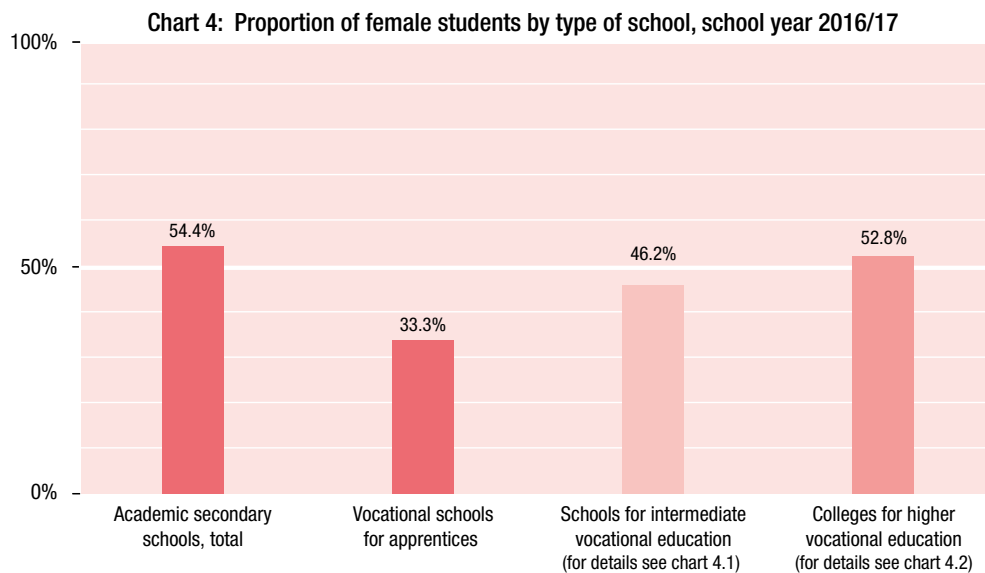


Chart 4.2: Proportion of female students in the various fields of study at Colleges for higher vocational education, school year 2016/17

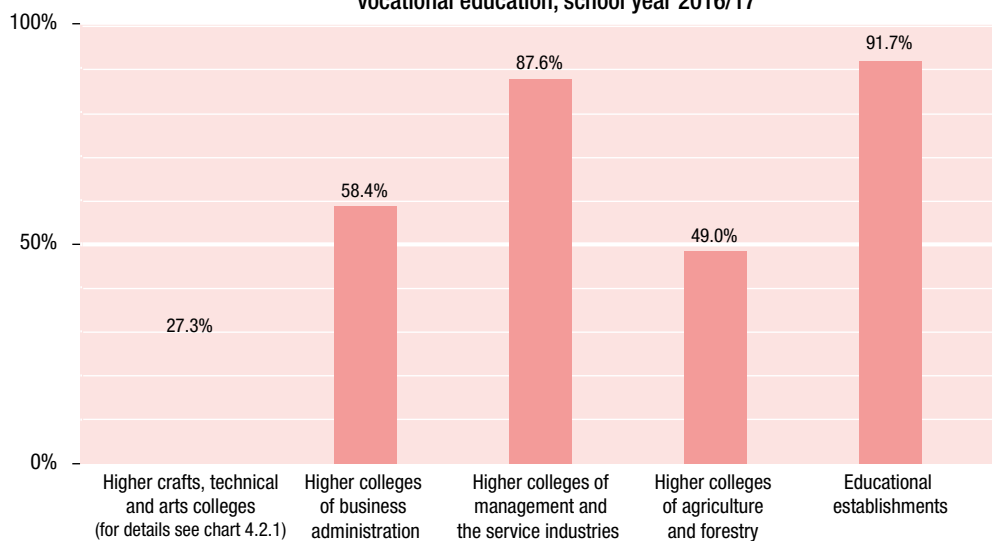


Chart 4.2.1: Proportion of female students in the Higher crafts, technical and arts colleges school year 2016/17

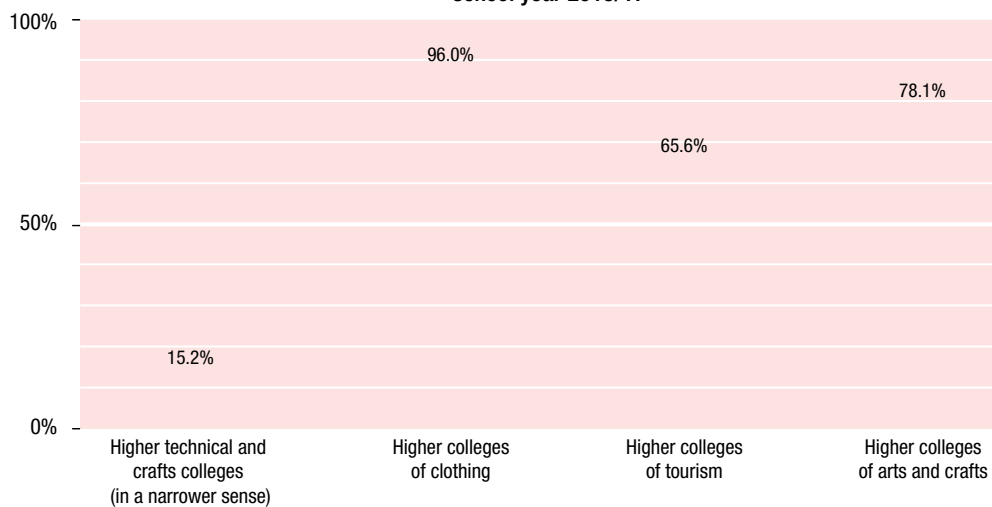

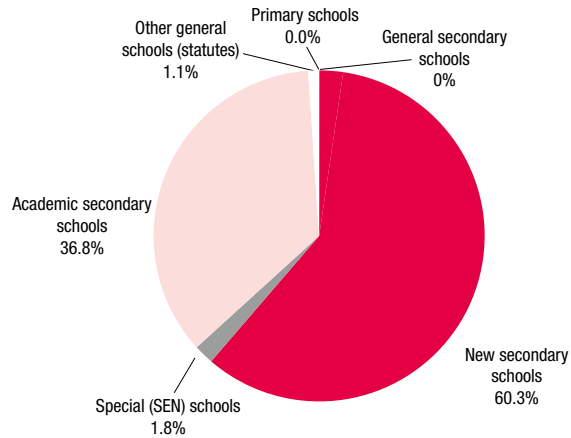

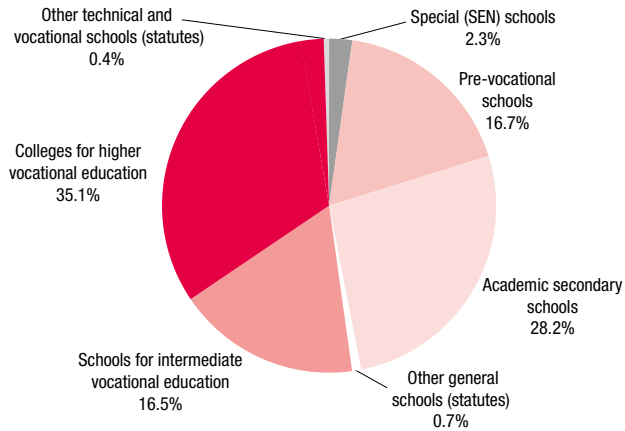

school year 2016/17**

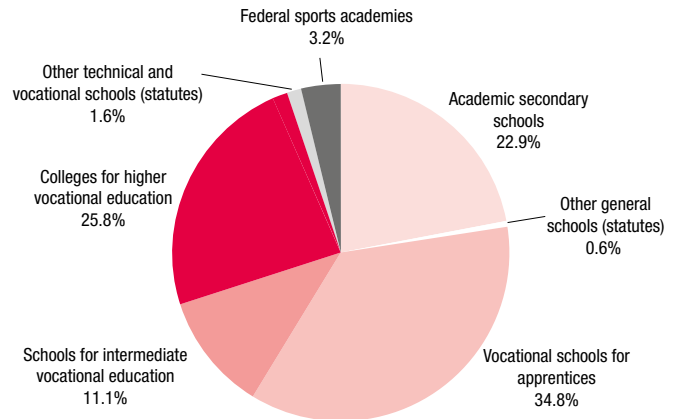

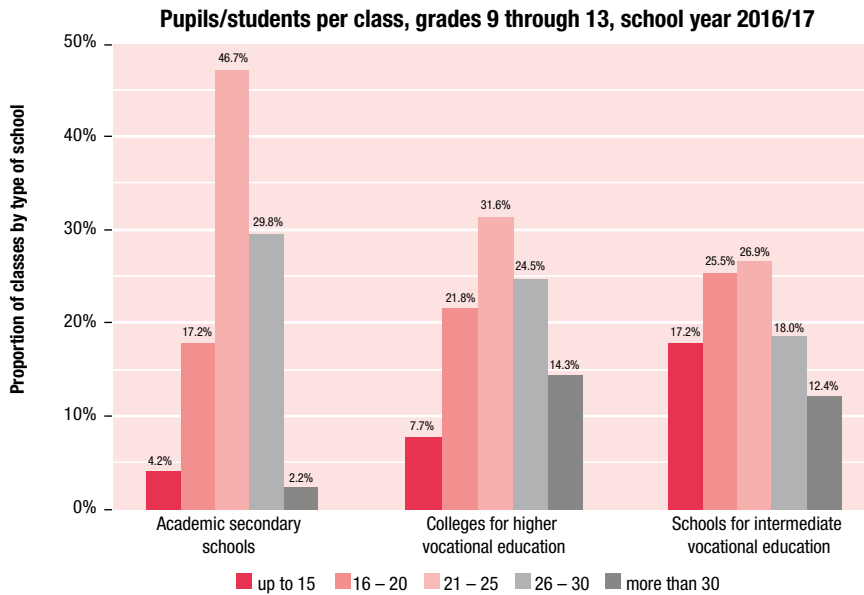

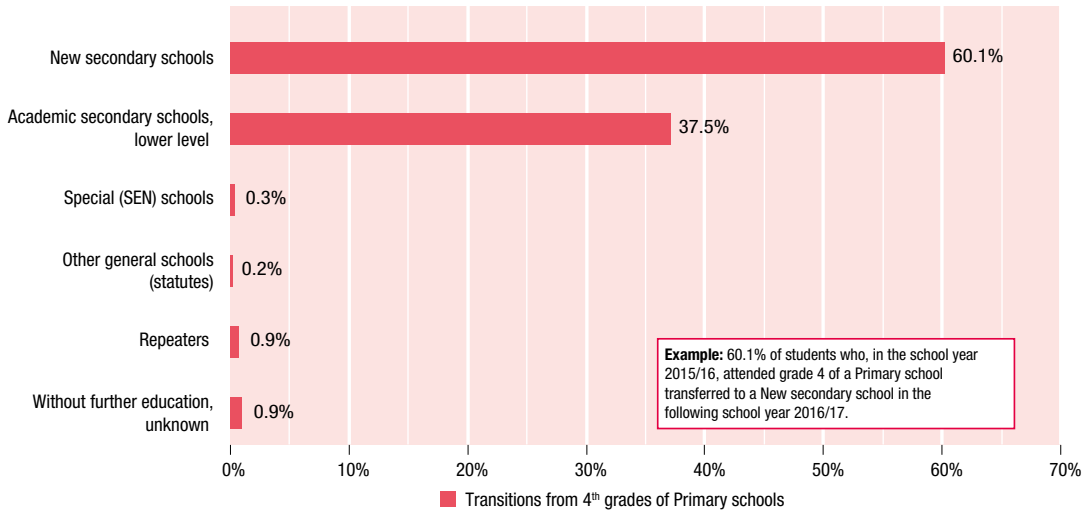

Transitions from 4th grades of General secondary schools, New secondary schools and Academic secondary schools, lower level, school year 2016/17

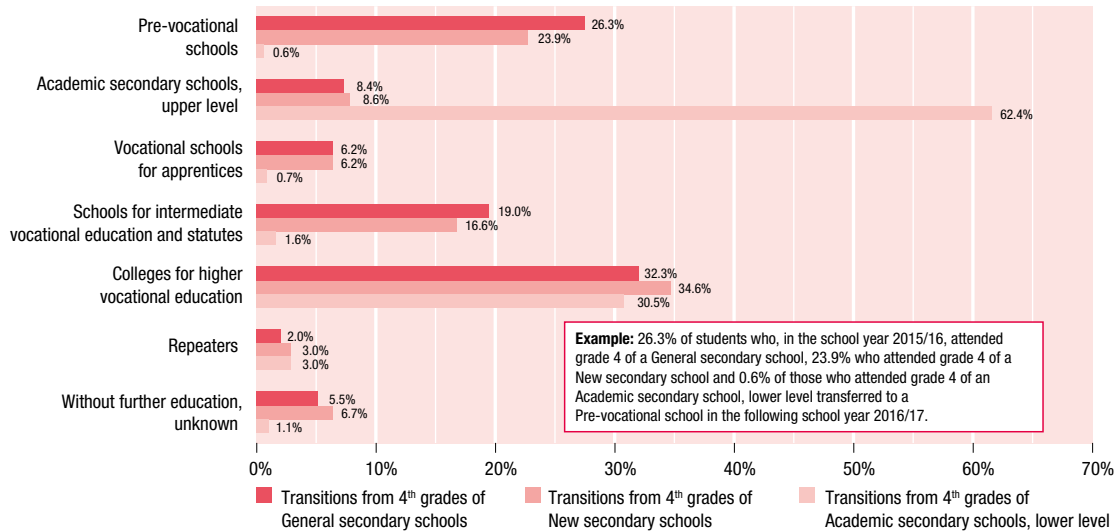
